

SISTER M. PAULINE CLEMENS NUMBER: 2
DATE OF DEATH: OCTOBER 17, 1870
DATE OF BIRTH: OCTOBER 26, 1856

On the 17th of October, 1870, Sister Pauline Clemens, a novice, died of typhoid fever at St. Anthony's mission house in St. Louis, Missouri, in the fourteenth year of her age. It was remarked by one of the priests, that the angelic expression of innocence in her face betokened her ripeness for heaven. She was buried in Calvary cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri, Section Number 11, which is set aside for priests and religious. Rev. Alardus Andreschek, OFM, officiated at the obsequies.

P.S.: In September, 1989, the Archivist searched Calvary cemetery, Section 11, and found no grave site for Sister Pauline. Upon inquiry, the chronological record in the cemetery office revealed that she was buried in the Friars' plot in Section 7, Lot 108. There is an unmarked grave in this position in the cemetery.
