## Sister Eleanor A. Fallert, OSF

Sister Eleanor Fallert was born on March 3, 1915 in Sigel, Illinois to Joseph and Dorothy Kaufman Fallert. She was baptized Eleanor Anne at St. Michael's in Sigel. She was the only girl of four children. Her brothers Ralph and Albert preceded her in death. She is survived by her younger brother Leonard and his wife Geraldine who live in Effingham, Illinois, as well as many nieces and nephews. Our Sisters Marie Therese Kaufman and Rosita Renschen are her cousins.

After graduating from St. Michael's School in Sigel, Eleanor attended St. Francis Preparatory for one year. At the age of 15, on September 8, 1930, she began her postulancy. On August 12, 1931, Eleanor was received into the novitiate and received the name Sister Mary Elmo. After the Second Vatican Council she returned to her baptismal name of Eleanor.

On August 12, 1933, Sister Eleanor made her first profession of vows. She then began her 68 years as an educator at St. John the Baptist School in Joliet. Sister Eleanor served various schools in Illinois, Ohio and Missouri, including five years at Immaculate Conception, Kankakee; six years at St. Jude's, Joliet; and a total of 30 years at her home parish of St. Michael's, Sigel. Because Sister Eleanor was a music major, along with her other duties she often taught music and was organist for the parish church. From 1959 until 1987, except for one year of study, she was also principal at the schools she served.

In 1987 she wrote that after more than 25 years in administration, she "would like to go back



into the area of just teaching." And thus began her 14 years in ministry with her dear friend, Patricia Kirk, at three different parishes in the St. Louis, Missouri area. On the occasion of her Diamond Jubilee in 1993, Sister Eleanor wrote that 60 years of dealing with youth kept her spirits young. She especially liked preparing her students for the sacraments and wrote, "Bringing the Lord into the hearts of the children is my specialty."

Just a few months ago, Sister Eleanor was diagnosed with cancer. Though not always feeling well, as late as eleven days ago, she continued her part-time teaching and tutoring ministry at St. Joseph's. After slipping into a coma the day before, Sister Eleanor quietly ended her earthly journey in the early morning hours of March 8, 2001.

Sister Eleanor, we thank you for your 70 years of service as principal, teacher, musician and friend. As you begin your eternity with the God you served so faithfully and joyfully, continue to remember us, your family, your friends, your Franciscan sisters. Amen! Alleluia!
