Sister Consilia Felder was born in Columbus, Ohio on October 6, 1901 to Anton and Francisca Felder. Baptized at St. Mary Church in Columbus, she was given the name Elizabeth. She had two brothers, John and Joseph, and three sisters, Franziska (later to become Sister Julitta), Clara (who became Sister Fulgentia and died as a young sister of 27 years) and Rosina, her youngest sister who became Mrs. Ruppersburg. Elizabeth came to the postulancy in 1922, entered the novitiate in 1923 and made first vows in 1925.

One year later, on October 9, 1926, Sister Consilia bore the sorrow of her Sister Fulgentia'a premature death at age 27. Many years later, Sister Consilia was a daily visitor at the hospital in Columbus as Sister Julitta was seriously ill. Sister Julitta came to Our Lady of Angels where she died in 1975.

Sister Consilia was an active and energetic minister throughout her life. For almost 50 years she worked in Catholic schools, most of those years as a language and business teacher at the secondary level. Her students loved and respected her. They knew what was expected and came through with fine results.

When Sister Consilia left secondary education, she did not retire, but took on a variety of ministries and continued to be that loving and firm support to all around her. Sister Consilia received many honors for her work with the poor, the sick and the needy in Columbus. A note of appreciation from Donald Anderson, Associate Dean at Ohio State University, expressed it well: "All who have known and worked with you during your short tenure here in the College of Education would agree that we individually and the College as an organization are much richer as a result of your being and working here. I have met a relatively small number of truly 'beautiful persons.' I consider you to be one. I feel most fortunate that your life has touched mine." One of Sister Consilia's prized citations was from the Columbus Right to Life Society where she volunteered many hours of her time. She fed the hungry through the food pantry and visited the sick at Alum Crest Nursing Home.

In 1991, she came to Our Lady of Angels, and there continued to minister by her presence and her prayer. She kept her language skills alive by praying her rosary using a different language for each decade: German, French, Spanish, Latin and English. Her love for the Blessed Mother was obvious in her reverence and frequent use of Lourdes water, but also in her prayer life and her desire to imitate Mary in all she did.

Sister Consilia, we thank you for your loving and practical service to all of God's people. We, your Franciscan Sisters, your family, your friends and your students, ask you to intercede for us with Mary our Mother, to live our

lives with love and respect for all of life. May the joy of eternal life be yours as you are reunited with all whom you loved and served during your life among us. May you live with God forever. Amen. Alleluia.
