Sister M. Christian Gilgen, OSF

Sister Christian Gilgen was born to Ruth (Manheim) and Charles Gilgen in Chicago, Illinois on July 31, 1930. She was baptized Lois Ruth at St. Boniface Church on August 10th of this same year. She is survived by two sisters, Audrey and Patricia, brothers-in-law, nieces and nephews, a dear friend Yvonne as well as many sisters in our congregation.

After attending Mokena and New Lenox public grade schools and St. Francis Academy, Lois entered the congregation on September 5, 1949. At her novitiate ceremony on August 12, 1950, Lois received the name Sister Christian, the name she kept throughout her religious life. Christian was the name of her godfather. Sister Christian's education continued. She received a B.A. degree from the College of St. Francis and an L.P.N. certificate.

Her early career encompassed 12 years of teaching grade school and music lessons in Illinois, Ohio, and Michigan. Sister Christian was often seen working overtime. taking on extra shifts, or filling in when another worker did not appear as scheduled. She spent a lot of time at OLA helping wherever she could. There was a fun side also to Sister Christian. How she looked forward to those vacations with her sisters, Audrey and Patricia. She told of her stories fishing and doing other



fun things. Gardening also was a healing and enjoyable task for Sister Christian. She worked long and hard on her garden paths here at OLA and was thrilled to see the progress her flowers were making. Needle-work and other craft projects filled her free time as well.

Over the years, many of her superiors or employers commented on her earnest, prompt, dependable, trustworthy and helpful demeanor. This was evident as one worked side by side with her or observed her in her many tasks. It was also said that she was outspoken, bold, and deliberate in her actions. We saw this too. Sister Christian had all these qualities rolled into one. And that is why she is so memorable. If one came to OLA, Sister Christian was present, quietly doing what was hers to do. whether it was praying, nursing, keeping the medical records, tending to the garden, or playing the organ. She was a private person who worked in a quiet way serving the God that she loved so dearly. And when she went home to her God on Friday, July 15th, just 16 days before her 75th birthday, I am sure she smiled and was greeted warmly by a smiling, loving God.

Sister Christian, we will remember you and pray with and for you as you enjoy an eternity at the home of our generous God. We join our sisters, your relatives and friends as we thank God for you, for all that you taught us and shared with us. Amen. Alleluia.
