Sister Mary Ancilla Kopco, OSF

Sister Ancilla Kopco was born on July 13, 1915 in Johnstown, Pennsylvania to Stephen and Elizabeth Veres Kopco. Baptized Mary at St. Stephen's Church, she had two brothers, Stephen (now deceased) and Louis. Mary also had four sisters, Vern, Anne and two who died shortly after birth. After graduating from St. Stephen's Grade School, Mary came to Joliet to attend St. Francis Preparatory.

On September 8, 1930, at the age of 15, Mary began her postulancy. The next August she entered the novitiate and was given the name Sister Mary Ancilla. As a novice, it was noted by Sr. Ottilia that "she had a great interest in baking and cooking!" After first profession on August 12, 1933, Sister Ancilla began her 59 years in the Food Service/Homemaking ministry. In 1934 Sister Ancilla wrote to Mother Thomasine, "I love my work and also the sisters with whom I have worked. This makes my work much easier."

Sister Ancilla ministered in Illinois, Ohio, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania. She was stationed in Johnstown during the 1977 flood where she witnessed the devastation and terrible ordeal, especially for the poor. She served at St. Mary's in Columbus, Ohio for eight years where she also did Church work, as well as seven years at the Motherhouse and a total of 17 years at Our Lady of Angels, until she retired there in 1992.

Sister Ancilla loved to crochet; to listen to TV talk shows, because "she learned from them;" to clean; to read books, especially about food and to gather new recipes.

When asked who influenced her life, she named Sister Rosella, because she taught her "to belong to the construction gang and not the wrecking crew."



And Sister Ancilla said that she always tried to live accordingly.

Besides all the physical work that Sister Ancilla did in her life, she was a woman of prayer. She had a great devotion to her patroness, Our Blessed Mother, and could often be seen praying the Rosary and her favorite prayer, The Memorare. She also liked to have fun, as she enjoyed a good game of cards and she had a quick, dry wit. Above all, Sister Ancilla always expressed deep gratitude for the little things done for her.

The last few years, Sister Ancilla suffered greatly because of arthritis. Her body, which had worked so hard for so many years, was wearing out. She was anointed last Monday and had a final visit with her friend, Sister Emilita, Tuesday evening. Early Wednesday morning, September 27, not long after the nurses ministered to her, Sister Ancilla quietly and peacefully went to her God.

Sister Ancilla, we thank you for sharing your love and talents with us these 67 years. As your namesake, you are a true handmaiden of the Lord. May you continue to remember us, your family, your friends, and your Franciscan sisters. Amen. Alleluia.
