## For those who have been faithful, O Lord, life is not ended, but merely changed.

Sister Frances Marie was born in Joliet, Illinois to Mary and Anthony Kostelec on July 25, 1911. There were nine children in the family, seven girls and two boys.

Frances entered the Joliet Franciscans from St. Joseph Parish in Joliet, Illinois. This home parish for the Kostelec family always remained dear to them. Frances became a postulant on September 6, 1926 when she was fifteen years old. On entering the Novitiate, Frances was given the name Sister Gilbert. Her greatest desire on entering the Congregation was to graciously serve the sisters in the culinary arts. Her warm smile and sense of humor endeared her to all the sisters who have had the happy experience of living with her. Her cheerful manner and love of laughter were redemptive qualities under stress and strain.

One wintry day in Mansfield, Ohio, when the furnace didn't work, Sister Frances Marie suspended a large sign across the kitchen door which read: Many are cold, but few are frozen. Promptly, she served cups of hot coffee and home-baked kuchen. With happenings like this Sister Frances Marie endeared herself to those who lived with her and worked with her. For over forty years, Sister Frances Marie served her Franciscan Sisters in many of the Convents in Illinois, Ohio and Pennsylvania.

Sister Frances Marie considered the day she received the habit and became a Sister of St. Francis of Mary Immaculate one of the most important days of her life. Celebrating her Diamond Jubilee on June 24, 1989 marked the faithfulness of her dedication.

Sister Frances Marie became incapacitated as a result of strokes suffered in 1972. She came home from the missions to reside at Our Lady of Angels. Often she was seen flashing a bright smile from her wheelchair in spite of all her pain. Because of strokes which caused her to be paralyzed, Sister Francis Marie was no longer able to speak. She also lost most of her sight because of cataracts she developed during these last years. She then chose as her special ministry that of patient waiting and prayer.

Throughout her long days of sickness, Sister Angela Marie would be Sister Frances Marie's constant visitor, praying with her, telling her the news of the day and helping her in any way she could. It was fitting that as Sister Frances Marie quietly went to her God on Sunday afternoon, April 28, 1996, that Sister Angela Marie was at her side praying, just as she had done for her Sister Josephine Marie when she breathed her last on November 10, 1990.

Sister Frances Marie, may God bless you with everlasting peace and joy as you enter God's heavenly home with Jesus and His Blessed Mother. We ask you to pray for comfort and peace for your sisters, Agnes and Sister Angela

Marie, for all your nieces and nephews and for all your Franciscan family. May you who cared for so many during your life now know the peace of God's eternal care. Amen. Alleluia.
