Sister M. Angelica Le Grand, OSF

Sister Angelica Le Grand was born on March 27, 1916, in Benton, Missouri, to William and Mary Ann Diebold Le Grand. Baptized Magdalena Stella at St. Denis Church in Benton, she was called Lena by her family and friends. Lena was one of nine children. She had seven brothers, Denis, Paul, Harold, William, Charles, Alban and Francis, and one sister, Clara, our own Sister Rosabel. Her first cousin is Sister Zita Diebold.

On September 8, 1932, at the age of sixteen, Lena began her postulancy. She was received into the Novitiate on August 12, 1933, and given the name Sister Mary Angelica. After profession of first vows in August of 1935, she began her 44 years in education as teacher and organist at SS. Peter and Paul in Leonore, IL, where she remained for five years. From 1940 to 1942, she studied full time at the College of St. Francis and later earned a Masters of Education degree from DePaul University, Chicago. From 1942 until 1981, she was a teacher and organist in parish schools in Illinois, Missouri, Ohio and Michigan. This included her 16 years as superior, principal, teacher and organist at her home parish, St. Denis in Benton.

In 1981, because of a diocesan policy, Sister Angelica retired from education at the age of 65, leaving Benton and returning to Joliet. Thus began her "second career" as seamstress at Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home. She performed this ministry for 16 years until her official retirement in 1997. After suffering a stroke, Sister Angelica's health continued to fail until early on the morning of December 27. With Sister



Rosabel at her side, she quietly ended her journey on this earth and went home to her God.

From the beginning Sister Angelica was known as an excellent teacher and administrator. She was dedicated to, innovative with and loved by her students, who loved learning from her. As Fr. Edward Eftink, Superintendent for Schools for the Diocese of Springfield - Cape Girardeau, Missouri, once wrote about Sister Angelica, "She is determined that each student utilize his/her talent to the fullest during the time that they are in her classroom."

Earlier in her life, in her letter to Mother Thomasine asking to be received into the Novitiate, Sister Angelica wrote that she wanted to be a sister in order "to be of some good use to the community, to help take care of 'God's little ones,' and to live faithfully as a good religious until death." Sister Angelica, you certainly have fulfilled your hopes of so long ago. We thank you for being a fine educator, seamstress and sister to us. We thank you for showing us how to live faithfully until death. As you enjoy your eternity with God, continue to remember us, your family, your friends, your Franciscan sisters. Amen! Alleluia!
