

Sister M. Amadea Sabol OS &

Sister Amadea Sabol was born on December 8, 1902, in Johnstown, Pennsylvania to John and Barbara Palcak Sabol. Baptized Veronica Maria at St. Stephen's, she was the middle child of three. Her sister Mary and her brother Emil preceded her in death.

Veronica graduated from St. Stephen Grade School and attended one year of Commercial School in Johnstown. At the age of 19, Veronica came to Joliet and became a Postulant on December 28, 1921. Here she graduated from St. Francis Academy and later received a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of St. Francis.

On August 12, 1922, Veronica entered the Novitiate and received the name Sister Mary Amadea. After profession of vows on August 12, 1924, Amadea began her 50 years as an elementary school teacher and organist. This included 16 years at Guardian Angel Home, Joliet, and 17 years at Sacred Heart, Huron St., Chicago.

She often stated that she "loved to teach the little ones about God, to help them know God and love Him."

She believed in teaching so much that Amadea once wrote to the Congregation's Director of Ministry that Sisters should be "encouraged to teach as long as they can and then they should tutor." Following her own advice, once she retired from the classroom, she spent 15 years as a tutor, two at St. Mary's, Shelby, Ohio, and 13 years at the Motherhouse.



Sister Amadea was a kind person who loved music and loved to sing. During her years at the Motherhouse, she kept herself busy "doing odds and ends," taking care of the cats and listening to Paul Harvey.

In 1997, Amadea moved to Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home, where she spent her days helping her dear friend Sister Clarine Matava and praying for the needs of the Congregation and world. Just last December, she so enjoyed her 100th birthday party, especially the chocolates.

As she became more frail, she had good days and bad days. Last Monday, January 13th, the staff noticed a change as they could not rouse her. When checking on her at 11:55 p.m., they noticed that Amadea had quietly and peacefully gone home to her God.

Sister Amadea, you had a great faith and confidence in your God. We thank you for sharing your life with us as teacher, musician, sister and friend these 80 years. As you begin eternity with the God you loved and served so faithfully, remember us your family, your friends, your Franciscan Sisters! Amen! Alleluia!
