

Sisters of St. Francis of Mary Immaculate

In 2001 as she was preparing for her Diamond Jubilee, the 60th anniversary of her profession of First Vows, Sister Armella noted that she had come full circle! In 1941 she was assigned to the kitchen and bakery of the Motherhouse and now 60 years later she returned to her original place of ministry! Army wasn't much inclined to expressing her spiritual views but when asked to give her legacy she responded: "I leave my enthusiasm to all the Sisters who now have to cook, bake and prepare meals."

This enthusiasm had long ago been noticed by her directors in the postulancy and novitiate. They described her as "markedly industrious" and "a very dependable domestic Sister." Sister Eulalia reported her as "hasty".

Before professing her final vows at the age of 26, Sister Armella wrote: "I hope always to be of the greatest service to God and to my community." She credited Sister Rosalinda who was "patient and untiring with this beginner," for her formation in the ministry of cook and baker.

Sister Armella spent scarcely five years away from Joliet, two in Payne, Ohio, where Sister Edwina commended her as, "saving, economical, a good cook and manager." At Our Lady of Mercy, Granville, Ohio, for three years our Sisters and the boarding girls enjoyed Sister Armella's delicious meals.

Mary Agnes Schuster (Sister Armella) entered as a postulant on September 8, 1938 at the age of 20. Her home parish, St. Stephen, Johnstown, Pennsyvania, boasts of 66 women who traveled far to join our Congregation. For five years preceding her entrance, Mary had been at home helping with all that a family of eight children entails. Here she learned from the family the great skills which were to be to our benefit for more than 60 years. Sister Armella dearly loved her family! As recently as Christmas 2008 with the care of Father Michael Monshau, OP, she traveled the distance to be with

them at Tillie's home, 420 Orange Avenue, Johnstown, Pennsylvania. The home that held so many memories! Her youngest brother Robert, still the "baby" in Army's words, traveled from Ohio to join in these visits. Nieces, nephews and their families, from East and West Coasts and points between gathered to celebrate Christmas, Easter, and July 4th. Each summer the cemetery, where Sister Armella's father had been caretaker, continued to be the site for the family's remembering service.

In 2000 Sister Armella spent time in Seattle, Washington, with her brother Francis as he prepared for heaven. To do this family ministry, Sister Armella left her position at Guardian Angel Home, one she held since 1967. During these 33 years she had been cook, baker, homemaker, parent, friend, mediator, mentor, fundraiser, organizer and principal inspiration to countless men and women. She and Sister Marcelyn also became synonymous with Guardian Angel Home. Sister Armella's favorite holy place was the Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes, constructed by former residents of the Home and refurbished by the GAH Alumni in the 1980's. Sister was ever vigilant to keep the light burning for all those passing by on Theodore and Plainfield Roads. She prayed that Mary and Bernadette would intercede for the safety of all!

We commend our Sister, friend and teacher of many of life's simple lessons into hands of the Greatest Teacher. Amen. Alleluia!
