Sister Mary To Vitale, USF

Sister Mary Jo Vitale was born in Chicago, Illinois on January 2, 1915. Baptized Josephine, she was the only daughter of Philip and Carmella Bonomo Vitale. Her four brothers, Charles, Harold, Philip and Michael, preceded her in death.


Josephine received her elementary education at Visitation Grade School in Chicago. She attended Sacred Heart High School in Englewood, where she became acquainted with our sisters. After entering the Postulancy on September 8, 1932, she graduated from St. Francis Academy.

On August 12, 1933, Josephine became a novice and received the name Sister Mary Philip. When given the opportunity to return to her baptismal name, she chose to be known as Sister Mary Jo.

Sister Mary Jo received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the College of St. Francis and through the years attended the Seraphic Institute of Theology, specialty courses in reading at John Carroll in Cleveland, Ohio, and various workshops, including one in literacy training.

After profession of vows on August 12, 1935, Mary Jo began her 43 years in elementary education, serving in parish schools in Illinois and Ohio. Through the years she taught grades 1 through 6, including six years at SS. Peter and Paul in Chicago and a total of ten years at St. Pascal in Chicago.

In our Congregation's publication of 1997, A Patchwork Quilt, Mary Jo wrote, "Sixty-one years ago I said good-bye to my classmates and Sisters at St. Francis Convent in Joliet to become one of the hundreds of teaching Sisters who would be welcoming teary-eyed or smiling students into their classrooms. Joy, mingled with apprehension, filled my heart that first day at St. Pascal School in 1936, as I greeted 40 fourth grade smiling faces eager to meet their friends and their new teacher. I loved



my life at St. Pascal's and I loved every minute of every day of my teaching experience there."

After retiring from teaching in 1978, Mary Jo served as Secretary to the Dean of Students at St. Francis Academy, as Medical Records Clerical Assistant at Our Lady of Angels and as Librarian at St. Jude School in Joliet. Though while teaching she had tutored during the summer at St. Francis Learning Center, she spent 1987-88 and 1991-96 tutoring year round. Mary Jo once wrote, "I love teaching. It is rewarding to see the children progress and I'm happy because they are learning."

In 1997, Sister Mary Jo retired to Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home. She loved going up and down the halls greeting everyone and always had a smile on her face. Recently, she became more and more frail and on January 24, 2002, her earthly journey ended and she went home to her God.

During Initial Formation, Mary Jo was known as cheerful, obedient, good at her studies and diligent at work. Before her entrance, her pastor, Fr. Egan, wrote that she was a "bright and pious" girl. At the time of her Diamond Jubilee, she wrote that her favorite activity was "going to a quiet chapel and praying." And she could often be found there.

Sister Mary Jo, we thank you for the 69 years you spent with us as teacher, sister and friend. As you begin your eternity with the God you served so faithfully throughout the years, remember us your family, your friends, your Franciscan Sisters. Amen. Alleluia!
