Sister Emerentia Azman learned the mystery of waiting many times over these past 78 years. As a baker she knew that yeast dough could not be rushed. It needs time to rise. If rushed, the bread fails. So she also learned to wait for the Lord. When she came to Our Lady of Angels in March of 1983, many believed that the Lord would be coming for her soon, and now after three years of waiting, Sister Emerentia received the promise of the Lord when He came for her on Friday, August 8, at 11:45 p.m.

Sister Emerentia was born on October 8, 1907 to John and Mary Azman. She was christened Mary Stella on October 20 in St. Joseph's Church, Leadville, Colorado. Sister Emerentia entered the Congregation on January 19, 1930 as a member of St. Joseph's Church, Joliet.

As a young sister she showed promise of being a fine cook and baker and was asked to serve in domestic work for her sisters in Ohio and Illinois. Many of these years were spent at Sacred Heart, Englewood, where she endeared herself to the parishioners and Sisters. She enjoyed her work and considered it to be essential for community living. As she stated on a survey in 1971, "The sisters tell me I keep their bodies and souls together." On another survey she wrote, "I am willing to give the service I can give at this stage of life."

In 1976 realizing that she could no longer give this service to her sisters full-time, Sister Emerentia returned to the Motherhouse to provide part-time service in the bakery. Even at this part-time position, she still gave her dedicated service to her sisters. She knew the sisters loved home-made bread so she would spend hours in the bakery waiting for her yeast dough to rise so that she could get the bread baked for the evening meal. At Christmas time she knew the sisters would enjoy cookies for their coffee break during the holidays, so the aroma of freshly baked cookies would permeate the Mother-house during the days preceding the holidays.

We rejoice that the Lord has kept his promise to our sister. While we will miss her smiling presence and hearty laugh, we know that her long wait is over. We offer our sympathy to her sisters, Dorothy, Rosemary and Ann and to her brothers, Edward and William. We ask God to comfort them with the realization that she has received the inheritance awaiting her.
