Sister Eustacia Charlow

On April 10, 1901, death claimed another child that had been reared in Saint Mary's Institute at Bayfield, namely Sister Eustacia, formerly Catherine Charlow. Her parental home was in Cloquet, Minnesota where her father, John Charlow and before him her grandfather had held the honorable title and position of Chief of one of the Chippewa Indian tribes on the St. Louis Reservation in Minnesota.

Sister Eustacia received her name in religion on the request of a Franciscan Father who bore that name and was well acquainted with her parents. She served God faithfully in the convent for eight years and was a good religious in every respect. No word of complaint escaped her lips during her long siege of illness. At the time of her departure she was in the twenty-sixth year of her age and in the ninth of her religious life. Her death occurred at the Motherhouse in Joliet.
