Sister M. Pacifica Dicker, the former Jacobina Dicker, was born in Aalten, Holland, on April 24, 1857, to Bernard Dicker and Emma Rhein. She entered the postulancy from St. Joseph parish, Cleveland, OH, on October 10, 1883, the novitiate on March 25, 1884, made first vows on August 14, 1886, final vows on August 12, 1889. Sister Pacifica celebrated her Golden Jubilee June 29, 1934, with Sister Ludovica, and her Diamond on June 24, 1944. Sister Pacifica died in her 93rd year after living 65 years in the Congregation.

Sister Pacifica was a Primary Teacher for a total of 13 years at St. John, Joliet, and later served as Portress there for 4 years. In the Chicago Area she taught at St. Pascal, St. Wenceslas, St. Procopius, Sts. Peter & Paul, St. Francis Xavier and in Des Plaines. She also served in Rock Island, IL, and in Wisconsin at Eau Claire, and Bayfield. For a time she taught the small girls at St. Francis Academy, taught in the Normal School and worked with the Aspirants. Her final years were spent at St. Francis Convent where she died.
