Rachel Dillon was born on January 23, 1860, to Charles and Johanna Kale Dillon in Bellefontaine, OH. Both of her parents were born in Chambersburg, PA. Rachel came to the postulancy from St. Peter Parish, Mansfield, OH, on July 4, 1874, then on July 19, 1874, began her Novitiate as Sister M. Eugenia. Sister M. Eugenia died at the age of 83 in the 69th year of her religious life. She had celebrated her Diamond Jubilee in 1934 with Sisters Joseph, Felicitas, and Martina. The cause of death was given as acute myocardial decomposition for the final five days of her life.
