Sister M. Bernadette, formerly Maria Anna of Detroit Michigan, entered the Congregation on February 21, 1891, at the age of 20. After completing her postulancy, she entered the Novitiate on August 12, 1891, and then professed her First Vows on August 1, 1893, and her Final Vows on July 25, 1896.

Sister Bernadette spent her entire fifty-six years in the Congregation doing domestic work. Her missions included:
