



Sister Constance Grojean

Late in the evening of June 8, 1933, Sister Constance was summoned by her Divine Master to receive the final diploma of eternity upon completion of her long religious life. At the time of her death Sister Constance was in the eighty-first year of her age and the sixty-second of her religious Reception in June, 1932. She had been confined to the Convent Infirmary for about three years before her death, principally because of old age and other infirmities. Sister was unconscious for some hours before her death, and then just slept away. She did not regain consciousness at all.

Sister Constance had spent many years in the classroom and also as superior at different missions of the Community. She was an untiring worker and had been loved and admired for her calm and gentle disposition. When advancing age compelled her to give up active service in school, after having spent more than fifty years in training God's little ones, she devoted her time to making beautiful embroidery, a work in which she excelled. She assisted, too, in the making of vestments, altar linens and other articles for the divine service.

Sister Constance was buried on June 12, 1933 in St. John's Cemetery, Joliet, Illinois.
