Dear Sisters,

On July 20, 1975, Sister Dolores Hohman entered into eternal life. For years, Sister Dolores was a patient at Our Lady of the Angels, but for the week, Sister became worse and on Saturday, July 19, she was admitted to St. Joseph Hospital. It was there she died the following day at 9:50 p.m.

On April 6, 1975, Sister celebrated her eighty-fifth birthday. She was born in Chicago, Illinois to Henry Hohman and Anne Jaswinski Hohman in 1890. She was given the name Mary at the time of her Baptism in Holy Trinity Parish, also in Chicago.

Mary Hohman entered our Congregation as a postulant on December 24, 1911 and professed her first vows on August 12, 1914.

Sister's teaching career began in 1914 at St. Peter's in Mansfield, Ohio. She also taught at St. Mary's, Columbus, Ohio; Central Catholic High and Marybrook Academy in Toledo, Ohio and Pesotum, Illinois. She served as Principal at Immaculate Conception, Columbus, Ohio; St. Clement's, Chicago, and St. Mary's in Des Plaines, Illinois. Sister also spent several years as Regional Community School Supervisor. In 1950 she became an instructor and the chairman of the Education Department at the College of St. Francis. In 1956 Sister Dolores worked in the Reading Center in affiliation with the Education Department. In 1962 she became the director of the Reading Clinic and remained its director until November, 1967, when she was taken to Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home as a patient.

Sister is survived by a sister, Catherine Hohman of Chicago and a niece, Mrs. Helen Kenson of Joliet.

We invite the Sisters of her Franciscan Community, her relatives and her friends to celebrate her Death-Resurrection at a funeral liturgy on Tuesday evening, July 22, 1975 at 7:30 p.m. Burial services will be at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, July 23, 1975 at Our Lady of Angels with interment at Resurrection Cemetery in Lockport, Illinois.
