United States as a young woman of seventeen or eighteen and shortly thereafter entered the Congregation. Her mother remained in Czechoslovakia.
Although we know little of her family, we know Sister Blanda had a niece
and nephew in Dominican congregations.

For us as Joliet Franciscans, Sister Blanda's life may be the symbol of our commitment to "accept one another with patience" and to "bear each other's burdens with compassion." (Constitutions)

In her active years of ministry Sister Blanda worked as a housekeeper in many convents. She cleaned the convent with a compulsion! She was known to have been self-willed, upright and humble. Between 1956 and 1968, Sister Blanda resided at the motherhouse. She took a special interest in the sisters who were in formation, affectionately calling them "incubakers." She passed on her words of wisdom: "Don't kick the bucket" and "Don't jump the fence" to many postulants and novices.

Since 1968 Sister Blanda has lived at Our Lady of Angels. Her compulsion for cleaning was replaced by a compulsion for prayer. She prayed many rosaries for her Franciscan community.

We thank God for the people who surrounded her and cared for her during her life. We pray for Sister Blanda that she may now know peace.
