Sister Angela Jansen was born in Quincy, Illinois on July 20, 1900 and baptized Agnes Anna on the same day. She was the second of nine children of Henry J. and Mary Rose Kalmer Jansen. Her older sister was Marie, whom we knew as Sister Solana Jansen.

When Agnes entered the Joliet Franciscans in November of 1922, her parish pastor wrote that she was a "pious, humble, obedient young lady." The well-known Mother Angela Rosenberger died in March of 1923, so when Agnes Jansen was received as a novice, she was honored to have received the name, "Sister Angela."

Sister Angela's places of ministry included Mansfield, Joliet and Chicago. She began as a teacher and taught in grade schools for six years. Being very proficient in business subjects, she found a special talent for teaching them. Sister Angela taught business subjects in high schools for twenty-six years. In addition to teaching, Sister Angela used her talents as bookkeeper, assistant registrar and secretary in various places. She was retired at Our Lady of Angels for the last seven and a half years of her life.

In a recent response to the question, "Whom do you feel influenced your life the most," Sister Angela wrote directly and to the point, "Our family at home, my parents especially." This response came as no surprise to anyone who knew Sister Angela and her deep love for her family. Her eyes talked and they shone whenever anyone talked with her about family and her roots in Quincy.

After suffering a stroke and a long illness, Sister Angela died a very peaceful death on Sunday, December 28th at Our Lady of Angels.

We extend our sympathy to Sister Angela's sisters: Cecilia Volm, Adelaide Hummert, Rosalia Jansen and Rita Jansen and to her brother, Leo. We also extend sympathy to many nieces and nephews and other relatives who survive her.

Family was very special to Sister Angela. Perhaps her death on the feast of the Holy Family tells us the meaning. In 1981 Sister Angela and Sister Solana made a request to be buried next to each other. Sister Solana died on August 18. Tomorrow morning their bodies will lie next to each other as they (and we) await the resurrection of the dead! And now we celebrate her life among us and her death as we say with Sister Angela:
