



Sister Annunciata Jaros

Sister M. Annunciata Jaros of St. Ludmilla's Parish in Chicago, Illinois, full sister of Sister Rudolpha and Sister Regis, died at the Motherhouse on October 19, 1930 in the 35th year of her age and the first year of her religious career.

Her health began to fail shortly after her reception into the Novitiate. She was obliged to enter the Infirmary. Dr. Arthur Fahrner in a consultation with Dr. Adelman pronounced her case malignant. She was a carcinoma patient. Sister Annunciata undoubtedly contracted this disease from her parents whom she tenderly nursed in their illness before her entrance into the Congregation. She died resigned to God's Holy Will.

The solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated at 9:00 o'clock on the twenty-first of October. Rev. Louis Johantges, O.F.M., was celebrant of the mass. Rev. Lullus Seeboth, O.F.M., deacon and Rev. Roman Hasenstab, O.F.M. subdeacon. Rev. Francis Tony, pastor of St. Ludmilla Parish, Chicago, and Rev. Joseph Chvatal, O.S.B., Chicago, were present in the sanctuary. Her remains were interred in St. John's Cemetery.
