Dear Sisters,

After a long and painful illness, Sister Francis Krivanek was called to her eternal reward at 9:30 this morning in the presence of many of her Sisters in Christ, and fortified with the Last Sacraments.

Sister was born in North Judson, Indiana on August 26, 1894 and entered our Congregation on September 25, 1915.

Sister began her teaching career at St. Procopius, Chicago, in 1917 to 1918, and returned there in 1948-1952 and again in 1953-1954. Sister spent six years at St. Ludmilla's in Chicago, one year at SS. Cyril & Methodius, one year at St. Francis of Assisi, ten years at SS. Peter & Paul, one year at St. Wenceslaus, two years at Our Lady of Guadalupe, and she rounded out her Illinois years at Streator, DesPlaines, and Lombard. Sister taught at St. Peter's, Mansfield for two years, from 1921-1923.

Sister also taught in Joliet -- at Holy Cross for three years and at Guardian Angel Home where she was Prefect of Senior girls from 1955 to 1963. In 1965 Sister retired to Our Lady of Angels where she resided until her death.

Sister is survived by two sisters and three brothers: Mrs. Marie Bartunek and Mrs. Charles Komarek of Brookfield; Mr. John Krivanek of Berwyn, Charles of LaFarge, Wisconsin, and George of Naperville. To these dear ones, we extend our deepest sympathy.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday, September 21, at 10 a.m. from Our Lady of Angels, where a Mass of the Resurrection will be sung. Burial will take place in Resurrection Cemetery in Lockport.
