Sister Agreda Lidinsky was born in Chicago, Illinois on March 19, 1905 to John and Katherine Masek Lidinsky and was baptized Josephine Agnes at St. Wenceslaus Church in Chicago. She attended St. Ludmilla School. The example of her teachers there, especially Sisters Petra and Baptista, who were women of prayer and dedication, influenced Josephine to enter religious life. Father Edgar Zurlinden, SJ, her spiritual director, wrote to Mother Thomasine saying, "Josephine who desires to enter your community has been under my direction for several years. She has shown splendid good will to improve spiritually and has been under a temporal vow of chastity." Josephine became a Postulant with the Joliet Franciscan Sisters on September 2, 1929 and entered the Novitiate the following August when she was given the name Sister M. Agreda.

health reasons, Sister Agreda was first sent to Holy Family School in Bayfield, Wisconsin. There she served the Chippewa Indians by giving the girls at the Boarding School much love and understanding. Throughout her 25 years there she taught each grade, and was principal as well. The highlight of her life was her Silver Jubilee Celebration at Holy Family. Sister Agreda wrote, "My 25 years of ministry in Bayfield were most rewarding to me. When I visit Bayfield and meet my former pupils, I can see that my ministry was not in vain. I still have that same love for the people in Bayfield." This affection was truly mutual. When Sister Agreda celebrated her Diamond Jubilee in June 1992, the people at Bayfield created a special booklet for Sister Agreda containing this message, "We are proud to say that 25 of your years were spent here with us in beautiful Bayfield. You have left your spirit of love and fun. We are happy to claim you as one of our own. You are truly a great example for each of us."

The remaining years of her teaching ministry were spent in schools in Joliet, Chicago and Toledo, OH. Sister Agreda said of herself, "Reading is my specialty." She enjoyed tutoring children with reading problems and continued to be involved in the Reading Program at the Motherhouse when she retired there in 1976.

Just two years ago, Sister Agreda moved to Our Lady of Angels. God gradually took away her hearing and her sight. During these past months cancer filled her whole body. She longed for Jesus to let her die. The Sisters at Our Lady of Angels kept a faithful vigil the past two days as her condition weakened. Her prayer was finally answered. Being born on the Feast of St. Joseph and named after him, she had great devotion to St. Joseph. It was on a Wednesday that St. Joseph quietly came and took her home to join her parents and five brothers and sisters.

Sister Agreda, we thank you for the gift of your life with us. Thank you for your joy and stability, your self-sacrificing and affectionate ways, your spirit of community living, prayer and peace making. You had inscribed in your Gos-

pel meditation book this prayer, "Day by day, Oh Dear Lord these things I pray, to see you more clearly, love you more dearly, follow you more nearly, day by day." Sister Agreda, you now see clearly the Lord whom you loved so dearly and followed so nearly. Amen. Alleluia.
