Sister Dominic McGowan

Sister M. Dominic, formerly Anna McGowan, daughter of John McGowan and Bridget Murry, born in New Brunswick, Canada, died of tuberculosis March 16, 1921, at the Motherhouse, Joliet.

Her chief occupation during her religious career was the care of household duties to which she ever gave full and undivided attention. For several years previous to her death she was unable to accept any charge because of failing sight which affliction, together with incipient lung trouble, she bore with much patience.

Sister Dominic was remarkable in the deference and respect she always showed in her dealings with superiors. Because of her ailing condition she would now and then become critical in regard to her equals, but she always refrained from detrimental remarks regarding authorities.

The day before her death she casually remarked, that she wished "to die all alone." This remark certainly indicated the preparedness of her soul for its departure hence, and the Lord granted her a quiet and peaceful end, by permitting her gently to fall asleep and thus pass away.

At her death Sister Dominic was in the seventy-fourth year of her age and in the forty-sixth of her religious life.
