SISTER M. VITALIS MISKO 455. JUNE 20, 1969

Sister M. Vitalis, formerly Mary Misko, died at Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home, Friday, June 20, 1969, at 12:12 a.m. The diseases that led to her death were: cancer, diabetes, congestive heart disease. Sister Vitalis was in her 78th year and the 57th of religious life. Funeral services were held on Monday, June 23, in Our Lady of Angels Chapel at 10 a.m., followed by burial in Resurrection Cemetery, Romeoville, IL.

Mary was born on February 2, 1892, to Andrew and Mary Dzopko Misko, in Johnstown, PA. Both her parents were born in Slovakia. Mary came to the postulancy in her 21st year with the recommendation of Rev. John Martvon, Pastor of St. Stephen Parish, Johnstown, Pennsylvania. Having begun her postulancy on September 6, 1912, she entered the Novitiate as Sister Vitalis on March 6, 1913. She pronounced her First Vows on March 6, 1915, and her Final Vows on August 12, 1919. Sister Vitalis earned her Bachelor of Science Degree in Education from De Paul University, Chicago, IL, in 1938. During the Diamond Jubilee of the Congregation, 1940, Sister Vitalis was a Silver Jubilarian, again in 1965, during the Centenary Celebration, she was among the Golden Jubilarians.
