Sister M. Cephas, Margaret Mary Redmond, died at Mansfield General Hosptial, Mansfield, OH, on March 9,1940, at 5:05 p.m., due to mitral regurgitation of the heart, contributory cause seem to be uremic poisoning.

Funeral Services were held in St. Peter Church, Mansfield, OH, on March 12 at 9:30 a.m., with burial in

St. Peter Cemetery, Mansfield, OH.

Margaret Mary, (Maggie), was born to John and Mary Burke Redmond, on August 28,1874, in Tipperary, Ireland. There is no record of when they arrived in Chicago, but Maggie's employer at the millner shop verifies her work there for three years (1895-98), prior to her entry as a postulant on August 3, 1898. She began her Novitiate as Sister M. Cephas on February 2, 1899 and made her First Vows on August 15,1901 and Final Vows on August 12,1907. Sister M. Cephas became a citizen of the United States on September 27, 1926, in Will County, Illinois, when she was 52 years old.

Sister M. Cephas was a native of Ireland and after having taught for a few years in the schools basically composed of children of other nationalities, she became discouraged and applied for a dispensation in 1913.
