Sister Euphrasia Rowe

Sister Euphrasia, formerly Regina Rowe of Mattoon, Illinois, died of tuberculosis at the Motherhouse, Joliet, Illinois, on April 5, 1906, in the seventeenth year of her age and the ninth month of her religious career.

Shortly after her reception Sister Euphrasia's health began to fail, consequently she was sent to the Kneipp Sanitarium at Rome City, Indiana, to recuperate. After spending several weeks there the presiding physician pronounced her case hopeless and Sister was brought back to Joliet. Her condition soon after became critical and she was permitted to take vows on March 11.

Because of her reserve, gentleness and childlike piety she was much loved by her companions. She died perfectly resigned to God's Holy Will.
