

SISTER M. GERMAINE RUMMLER
234. APRIL 10, 1940

Sister M. Germaine, Agnes Rummler, died at the Motherhouse on April 10, 1940 at 6:20 a.m. in her 73rd year and the 49th of her religious life. Her death was caused by chronic myocardial insufficiency due to chronic parenchymatous nephritis. Funeral services were held in the Motherhouse Chapel on April 12, with burial in St. John Cemetery, Joliet.

Agnes was born in Wiltgendorf, Prussia, to Albert and Pauline Delitsch Rummler on June 28, 1867. There is no record on file of when the family came to the United States. Agnes came to the community from Sacred Heart Parish, Detroit, MI. She entered the postulancy on November 20, 1890, at the age of 23. She became Sister M. Germaine, a novice, on April 16, 1891, and professed First Vows on August 1, 1893, and Final Vows on July 25, 1896. She became a citizen of the United States on May 21, 1925, when she was 57 years old.
