Dear Sisters and Associates,

Friday, December 20, found Sister Arcadia Sebastian busy about many things as she visited, wrote letters and conversed with the other Sisters at OLA with her customary pre-holiday enthusiasm. And so the reaction was one of universal shock and disbelief when, shortly after six in the evening we received word that "Archy," as she was affectionately known, had been called to celebrate Christmas '85 with extraordinary joy and jubilation among the heavenly choirs.

Although she had recently been hospitalized for treatment, Sister Arcadia had appeared to be well on the road to recovery, and was looking forward to returning to her first floor room, hopefully for the holidays. She was on her way to supper on C2 when she collapsed in the corridor, and died within that next half hour.

Sister Arcadia's long career in education included missions in Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Wisconsin. She gave generously of herself and was well respected by her students and their parents alike. In a report from one of her last teaching years, her principal stated, "Sister's rapport is good in all areas...her concern and interest in the students and school is great." After 50 plus years in the classroom, Sister spent her last dozen mission years at St. Mary's in Des Plaines, where she managed the household and worked in the sacristy giving herself to both activities with her characteristic concern and commitment.

An avid sports fan through the years, Archy could often be found dividing her afternoons between her many chores and her favorite games.

It is hard to remember Sister Arcadia without closely linking the name and the person of Sister Vera, her sister and confidante. Though born triplets, only the two sisters survived, both entering the Joliet Franciscans and remaining close through the years. Many recall the care and concern with which they looked out for one another to the very end.

We express our deep and prayerful sympathy to Sister Vera as well as to their sister Laura of Michigan and the many other nieces and nephews and family members who survive.

In the Gospel of the liturgy of Resurrection, we read, "Blessed is she who has trusted that the Lord's words to her would be fulfilled." We know that Sister Arcadia now joyously celebrates the rewards of that life-long trust and confidence.
