Sister Lullus Spisak

Sister M. Lullus, formerly Susan Spisak, daughter of Thomas Spisak and Anna Bosa, died of Chronic Pareuchymatous Nephrites on Tuesday, March 12, 1929, at 2:15 p.m. at the Motherhouse, Joliet, Illinois, in the thirtieth year of her age and in the fourteenth year of her religious life, having been fortified by the rites of Holy Mother Church.

Sister Lullus was engaged as teacher in Sacred Heart Parish (Slovak), Chicago, Illinois, from 1917-1923. Sister's ill health brought about a change. She was transferred to the Motherhouse infirmary where she had been a patient for six years (1923-1926) Sister Lullus was very patient during her long illness, ever cheerful and resigned to God's Holy Will. Her mother and oldest brother were at her bedside when she expired.

She was buried in St. John's Cemetery, Joliet, Illinois on March 14, 1929. Rev. Louis Johantges, O.F.M. officiating, assisted by Rev. Eligius Weir, O.F.M. and Rev. Alexiys Bender, O.F.M. The absolution was given by the Very Rev. Msgr. V. Blahunka, from the Sacred Heart Slovak Parish, Chicago, Illinois.
