Katherine Thele (Tehle) was born on September 16, 1852, in Krizanovich, Bohemia, the daughter of Paul and Katherine Werk Thele (Tehle). When she was a child her family emigrated to the United States and resided in Chicago. Katherine lived at 16th and Spring when she was admitted as a postulant on November 16, 1867. When she became a novice, Katherine received the name Sister M. Agnes on April 30, 1868. She made her First Vows on July 16, 1871 and her Final Vows on March 6, 1873.

Sister Agnes was 19 years old when she began teaching, which she continued to do until her health began to fail. Sister Agnes' teaching missions included:
