## Sister Mildred Von Hollen

On June 18, 1901, Sister M. Mildred, formerly Emilia Von
Hollen, died at the Motherhouse in Joliet in the thirty-fourth year
of her age and the seventh of her religious life. She had been a postulant in St. Joseph's Convent at Car ondolet, St. Louis, Missouri, but
being much troubled with home-sickness she soon returned to her parents,
who resided in Chicago, Illinois. Shortly after her return she became
acquainted with our Sisters at St. Boniface School and asked for admission into the Convent at Joliet. After being received there she felt
quite at home. As she had been educated in music before she entered
the convent, her superiors employed her in giving lessons on the piano
and at the same time she also took lessons on the mandolin and zither
in which she made good progress. In the sixth year of her religious
life she became a victim of tuberculosis, of which disease she shortly
before had lost a brother and a sister.
