Sister Celsa Vrabel

This morning, Pentecost Sunday, at 5:20-o'clock Sister M. Celsa Vrabel died at the Convent Home. As the last moments came rather suddenly only a few sisters could be called to her bedside. On the previous evening she had been annointed by Rev. Paul Eberle, OFM. Interred June 2, in St. John's cemetery, Rt. Rev. Msgr. F.A. Rempe had the Solemn Requiem, with Rev. Gratian as deacon and Rev. Adolf as subdeacon. Msgr. Rempe and Rev. Gratian at the cemetery. Novices and postulants were there also.

Sr. Celsa had been five weeks in St. Elizabeth's Hospital Chicago. She was brought home Monday, May 25th in the late afternoon by Mother Alexander on a Rock Island train.

She had been operated on for ruptured veins in the left leg, and got pneumonia at the hospital. This lung affliction was termed "gangreen of the lungs" by Dr. A Fahener. She had also a double internal goiter.

Born December 19, 1881 at ^Cortina Austria-Hungary, and became a resident of Johnstown, PA.
