Sister Estelle Weidner, christened Luella, was born in Buffalo Grove, Illinois in 1901. She entered the Congregation in 1928, following her older sister Marie, our deceased Sister Cordelia.

Sister Estelle was, in every way, a dedicated and committed minister of music, giving over 50 years of her life to music education in Ohio and Illinois. Sister was already an accomplished musician when she entered the convent and, over the years, had a special interest in orchestra and choral work in addition to giving lessons in piano, organ, violin, cello and bass. Her position as first violinist in the Summer Orchestra was always a source of great pride and satisfaction to her, and many remember Sister Estelle's performances and recitals as a classical violinist...she was truly a "string specialist."

As her health deteriorated in her later years, and debilitating arthritis set in, her mobility was curtailed but her enthusiasm and commitment to her art and to her students continued. Sister officially retired in 1981, when her failing health finally mandated a much less active lifestyle. Indicative of the fact that her lively spirit and enthusiasm were still very much alive though, was her recent response to a question about hobbies that she especially enjoyed. Her reply - Music, Music, Music!!!

Sister Estelle is survived by her sister, Edith and her nephews and nieces, including her Joliet Franciscan niece, Sister Yvonne Weidner. To all of them we extend our sincere sympathy.
