Dear Sisters,

At 11:10 p.m. on Friday, November 8, 1974, Sister Remigia Zlogar was called by her God to spend eternal life with Him. Sister had been critically ill last September but within the last few weeks had improved. Her death, therefore, was rather sudden but apparently no surprise to her since she recently had spoken often about her death. Sister had the privilege of visiting with her sister, Mrs. John Egan, only a few hours before she died.

Sister Remigia was born on February 21, 1892. Her parents were Frank Zlogar and Barbara Kramaric. The Zlogar family were members of St. Joseph Parish here in Joliet. She pronounced her first vows on August 12, 1924 and celebrated her Golden Jubilee as a professed Sister of our Congregation last summer.

Her years of ministry were spent at St. Procopius, St. Francis Assisi, SS. Peter & Paul, St. Boniface, and St. Wenceslas in Chicago. Sister also served at St. Mary's in Columbus, St. Mary's in Rock Island, St. Stephen's in Johnstown and St. Stephen's in Streator, SS.Peter & Paul in Leonore and at the Motherhouse. Since 1961, she has been a resident at Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home.

Mr. John Zlogar, her brother, and Mrs. John Egan, her sister, survive. Both are living in Joliet, Illinois.

The Congregation of Sisters will celebrate Resurrection with Sister Remigia at a Liturgy on Monday, November 11, at 7:30 p.m. at Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home. The burial Mass will be Tuesday, November 12, at 10 a.m. Burial will be in Resurrection Cemetery, Lockport, Illinois.
