

Sisters of St. Francis of Mary Immaculate

In the early morning of December 13, the Feast of Saint Lucy, as Sister Clarita's time of watchful waiting at the bedside of Sister Agnes Marie was coming to a close, Sister Agnes Marie drew her last breath and gave herself completely into the embrace of her loving God to whom she had given her whole life.

A native of Rockdale, Illinois, Theresa was born on October 7, 1924, to Mary (Karl) and Anton Kovacic. One of eleven children, she had three brothers — Anthony, George and Lawrence — and seven sisters — Agnes (Sr. Lambert), Marie, Louise, Margaret Rose, Anna, Antonia and Catherine. Sister Agnes Marie attended the Rockdale Public School and Joliet Township High School where she enjoyed her position in the marching band. She graduated from Saint Francis Academy and the College of Saint Francis. In 1944 she began a lengthy service of teaching, including serving as a Prefect of small boys at Guardian Angel Home in Joliet.

In 1983, Sister Agnes Marie retired from teaching and began a ministry of healthcare in patients' homes. She earned a certificate as a CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) and continued in that ministry until after the turn of the century, at which time Sister Agnes Marie offered her services as needed at Guardian Angel Home and at Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home. In the spring of 1994 her home parish of Saint Joseph in Rockdale chose Sister Agnes Marie to represent

the parish as the Woman of the Year by the Joliet Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.

Even in her retirement years, Sister Agnes Marie was available to help out as needed. She treasured her vegetable garden and loved to cook and prepare food for others. She was skilled in various craft works and art projects. She was known for having a great collection of things she was saving to use in her hobbies.

Sister Agnes Marie was a prayerful woman. She was aware of the needs of others and helped out where she could. She had a dry sense of humor and a captivating twinkle in her eye. She will be remembered for her willingness to be of service to others.

In her final illness Sister Agnes Marie would often grasp a small wooden cross made of olive wood as she prayed in her bed. That treasured cross was in her hands as she took her last breath and gave herself into God's loving embrace.
