Dear Sisters,

One of the oldest members of the Congregation, Sister Conrada Babicky quietly slipped away on November 21, 1973, at 3 a.m., to celebrate in Heaven the Presentation of Mary, to whom she had deep devotion.

Sister entered the Congregation, July 16, 1903, and made final vows, August 12, 1912. She celebrated her Golden Jubilee in 1956 and her Diamond Jubilee in 1966. Sister was 91 years old at the time of her death.

Sister Conrada taught in the elementary schools for 53 years. Thirty four of those years were spent at SS. Cyril & Methodius School in Chicago. Other schools in which she taught were St. Procopius and St. Ludmilla's in Chicago. She served as principal and superior of the latter for four years. In Cleveland, she taught 3 years at Holy Family and 2 years at St. Procop's. She retired to Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home in January, 1962.

Sister Conrada, the daughter of Frank Babicky and Josephine Kapka Babicky, was born in Loket, Bohemia, April 19, 1882. She was baptized Anna in her parish church in Bohemia and became a naturalized citizen in 1891. She entered religious life from St. Ludmilla's, Chicago.

She is survived by two nephews, James Martinek of Chicago and Ray Martinek of North Riverside, Illinois.

The Mass of Christian Burial, celebrating Resurrection with Sister Conrada, will be Friday, November 23, at 10 a.m., at Our Lady of Angels, followed immediately by burial in Resurrection Cemetery, Lockport.
