

SISTER M. RAPHAEL DLOUHY
114. DECEMBER 4, 1918

Sister Raphael, Rose Dlouhy, was born July 15, 1869, to Wenceslas and Katherine Vahout Dlouhy. She entered the postulancy on January 9, 1886, at the age of 16. She entered the Novitiate the following year and professed her First Vows in 1889. She died in her 49th year and the 32nd of her religious life. She was one of the many victims of the influenza epidemic of 1918. Although she died at St. Alexius Hospital, Cleveland, Ohio, her remains were returned to her home place, Chicago, for burial in St. Adalbert Cemetery, in the graves donated to the Community by the Archdiocese for our teaching of the children of emigrants. Sister Raphael was the natural sister of Sister Rose.
