Dear Sisters,

On the Feast of St. Michael, September 29, 1973, Sister Ewald Ellguth died at approximately 2:40 p.m. at Our Lady of Angels after a long and painful illness.

Sister Ewald, as Pauline Ellguth, entered the Congregation on February 11, 1918, and made final vows on August 12, 1923. She was the daughter of Simon Ellguth of Germany and Emilie Pelke of Poland. Born in Chicago in 1897, she was baptized at SS. Peter and Paul Church.

As an elementary teacher for 44 years, Sister was an especially dedicated person. Her last mission was at Green Creek, Illinois, where she taught in 1965-66. Some of Sister's most recent teaching experiences included St. Stephen in both Streator and Johnstown; St. Francis Assisi, St. Francis Xavier, and St. Francis de Sales in Chicago. She spent from 1966 to her death at Our Lady of Angels.

She is survived by one brother, Rudolph, of Pompano Beach, Florida.

The Sisters of the Area are invited to participate in the Mass of Christian Burial, celebrating Resurrection with Sister Ewald, on Tuesday evening, October 2, 1973, at 7:30 p.m. at Our Lady of Angels. The Funeral Mass will be Wednesday, October 3, 1973, at 10 a.m. at Our Lady of Angels. Burial will be in Resurrection Cemetery in Lockport, Illinois.
