

SISTER M. REGINA LYMANN

Sister Regina, Mary Lymann, was born on November 9, 1860, in Memphis, Tennessee. Thomas Lymann, her father was from Limerick, Ireland and Mary Sullivan Lymann, her mother from Cork, Ireland. Since her father became a citizen on June 26, 1862, this also included the children. Mary became a postulant on August 12, 1877, a Novice on August 25, 1877, professed First Vows on August 29, 1878, and Final Vows on August 5, 1881.
