

SISTER M. ANYSIA MOSS
254. APRIL 16, 1943

Sister M. Anysia, formerly Mathilda Moss, was one of the fourteen children born to Leonard and Anna Schlitz Moss. Of the four boys and ten girls, four girls joined religious communities; three joined us and one joined Maryknoll. Sister Anysia was the first of the girls to enter in Joliet. Sisters Hermenegild and Irmengard joined later.

Mathilda was born on September 25, 1890, in Aurora, IL. She began her postulancy on December 8, 1910, her Novitiate on August 12, 1911. Sister Anysia professed her First Vows on August 12, 1913, and her Final Vows on August 12, 1919. At the time of her death she was in her fifty-third year and thirty-second of her religious life.
